Sights- Original type vernier and aperture front. Hadley eyecups, along with scopes allowed, ³/₄ " scope and mount.

Propellant- Black powder or pyrodex only, no duplex.

Course of fire- five relays of ten shots each for score, Three relays on Saturday and two on Sunday. Five sighters, last three convertible for score, reverse count. We will be using 6x10 targets.

Schedule- Saturday meeting on range 6 at 0700. Will begin shooting shortly after 0800 hours. Sunday meet at range at 0730 to start by 0800 hours.

Awards- 1st, 2nd, 3rd Plagues 4th and 5th Medals for Muzzle Loading, Cartridge Class, and Inline.

Fee- Match fees \$65.00. (Please note, that unlike previous matches, registration for NMLRA National match is not required).

Rules- Safe conduct of all matches and activities shall be foremost. Any person conducting themselves in an unsafe manner will be asked to leave. Hearing and eye protection required. Everyone one will take turns in the pits. Bring a chair, food, water, rain gear, etc.. We will not be stopping for lunch.
